The Decision Theater consists of an interactive 3D immersive environment built with cutting edge graphics technologies. The core component, called the Drum, is a 260-degree faceted screen that can display panoramic computer graphics or 3D video content. This advanced environment enabled individuals to see a detailed 3D representation of the consequences of behavior, decisions and policy in order to examine potential future scenarios in new and exciting ways. But technology is just a tool! Jessica will take us through the facilitated Think Tank approach so we can understand how participants engage in a 'What if?' analysis of multiple scenarios. Each model is constructed in close collaboration with stakeholders to identify the key variables that matter most. In this way, the team at the Decision Theater is able to present decision-makers with visual depictions of possible policy options.
